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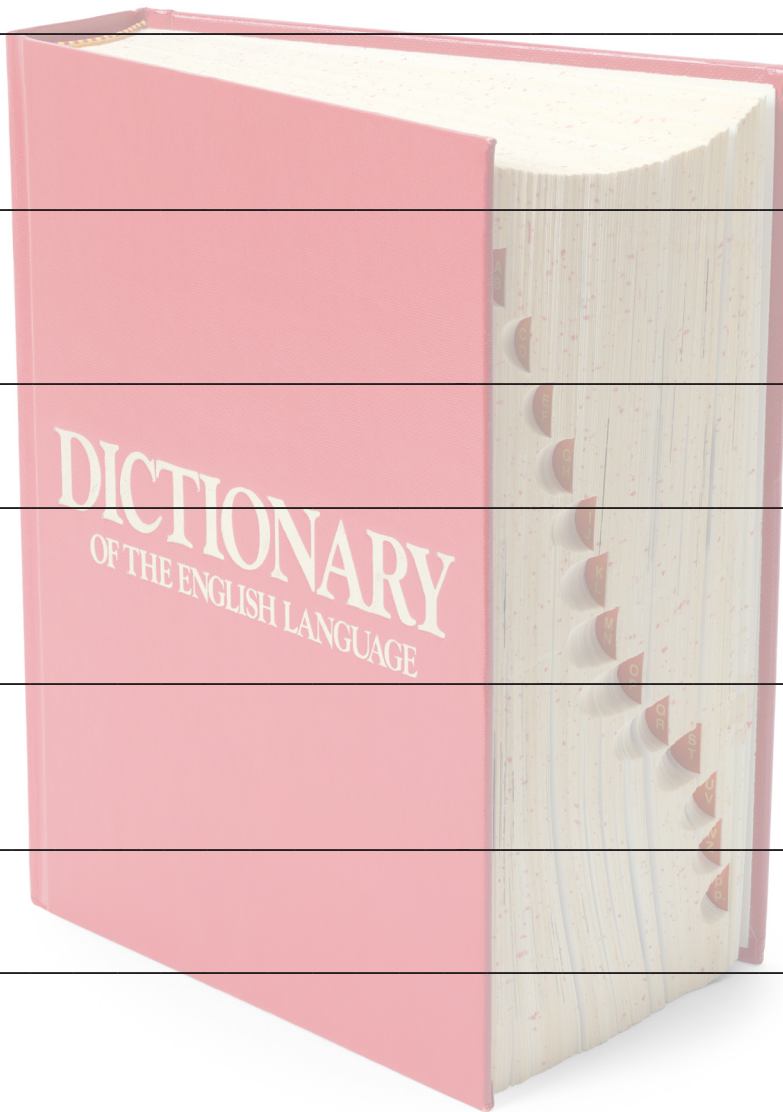

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Grow Group Discussion Questions

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life.

Point #1

- Read Matthew 28:18-19. What does it mean to make a disciple? How does this relate to Point #1?
- Why is it important for every Christian's spiritual health? Specifically, how will you apply Point #1 this year?

Point #2

- Read Matthew 28:20. What is entailed in "teaching them to observe" (i.e. obey)? How does Point #2 relate?
- In what way do you currently do this? What is one step you will take to spiritually grow this year?

Point #3

- Read Acts 2:44-47. Describe how the 1st century church related to one another. Give two examples.
- Why is this important? How would you rate your spiritual health in this area? How will you apply Point #3?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Matthew 4:18-20, 9:36-38, 28:18-19, Acts 1:8, Romans 10:14-15, 2 Peter 3:9

- How does today's reading highlight God's calling for every Christian? What is at stake?
- How do you see this happening in your life? What does this highlight about rebooting with God?
- In what way will you step into your calling directly or indirectly? How can PCC help?

TUESDAY // Read Matthew 28:18-19, John 1:35-50, Acts 10:19-48

- What approach did New Testament Christians use to share their faith with family and friends?
- What was the result? How does this approach make it easy for every Christian to participate in?
- How does this encourage you to do the same? What are some specific ways you will do it this week?

WEDNESDAY // Read Matthew 28:20, John 15:1-12, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, 2 Peter 1:5-12

- Explain how "teaching" and "observe" relate to one another. Why is this important for spiritual growth?
- How can church attendance, Grow Groups and Daily Devotions help? Why is consistency important?
- Specifically, how will you step into Matthew 28:20 in more significant ways for 2022?

THURSDAY // Read John 1:12-13, Romans 8:15-17, 2 Corinthians 6:16-18, Galatians 4:4-7, 1 John 3:1-2

- What spiritually happens when someone becomes a Christian? (i.e. adoption, family)
- What does this imply about church and Christian relationships? How does this adjust your perspective?
- Why does this make church attendance and grow groups critically important? How do you need to change?

FRIDAY // Read Acts 2:44-47, 2 Chron. 31:2-10, Matthew 6:19-24, Luke 21:1-4, 1 Cor. 16:1-2, 2 Cor. 9:7-8

- Why is tithing and financial giving to the church important to God? What does it reflect?
- What standards should Christians use for tithing/giving? How does this challenge your current approach?
- What steps of faith does God want you to take for financially giving in 2022? Take time to pray about it.

SATURDAY // Read Acts 2:44-47, Romans 12:3-8, Hebrews 10:24-25, Ephesians 4:1-7

- In what way is staying spiritually healthy a team effort? Why is isolation risky for any Christian?
- How can this topic be countercultural today? Give an example. How can this be a struggle for you?
- How would you rate your commitment to the PCC family? What steps will you take to change?
